RECTOR'S GREETING



Our University, despite its recent establishment (in 2018), originates from three historical and dynamic educational and research entities in the region of Attica: the Technological Educational Institute of Athens, the Piraeus University of Applied Sciences, and the National School of Public Health, which have produced thousands of graduates and contributed decisively to the development of the country, but also at a worldwide level. The first two institutions have had a remarkable 45 years course since their establishment, nearly 20 years of which in higher education. The National School of Public Health was founded in 1929 by Eleftherios Venizelos, preserving an outstanding contribution of 90 years.

The new University of West Attica (UniWA) was thus founded, bringing forth high academic standards, capitalizing on individual attributes of the former institutions and creating economies of scale and scope. It consists of 6 Schools (the School of Public Health, the School of Administrative, Economic & Social Sciences, the School of Food Sciences, the School of Health & Care Sciences, the School of Applied Arts & Culture, and the School of Engineering) and 27 Departments, covering a broad spectrum of disciplines.

The University has three Campuses (two in the Municipality of Egaleo—at Egaleo Park and the Ancient Olive Grove—and the third in Athens) while a fourth Campus is currently being developed in the area of Moschato. UniWA has approximately 55,700 undergraduate, 5,500 postgraduate and 460 doctoral students enrolled, a rapidly increasing number considering the fact that the preexisting institutions did not have the authority to provide doctoral studies.

Our strategy is to invest in people and our practice is to cooperate with the academic community based on a system of values, trust, stability and credibility with ethics and justice, providing equal opportunities and applying the University's meritocracy and accountability to society. At the same time, we are encouraging the intensification of digital transformation, innovation and academic cosmopolitanism.

We strive for the entire academic community to work harmoniously and creatively, with a common vision: for UniWA to be established as a first-choice, modern, and progressive University, with a publicly recognized and competitive role in worldwide education and research. A pleasant and multicultural higher education institution where all of us, along with our students, can live and socialize. A University that prioritizes health, self-determination, dignity, culture, sport and ecology.

Public and Community Health Department

The purpose of the Public and Community Health Department is to offer qualitative undergraduate and postgraduate education in the scientific field of public and community health. Its curriculum provides graduates with the necessary scientific knowledge and skills that enable them to comprehend the complex nature of public and community health issues, to make scientifically sound decisions and undertake coordinated action to protect, preserve and promote health, the individual, the family, the community and the population.

After the first three joint academic semesters, the bachelor's degree program is divided into two orientations, Public Health and Community Health, which guarantee the professional rights of their graduates.

In the context of the academic work carried out within the Department, emphasis is placed on research to produce new knowledge, applicable through documented good practices.

In particular:

- The Department has two institutional Research Laboratories: a) the Lab of Hygiene and Epidemiology—which cooperates with reputable research centers in Greece and abroad, has the scientific responsibility for the implementation of national and European research projects, and contains two highly active academic units: i) of Environmental Education and Communication, and ii) of Smoking Behavior Study—and b) the Lab of Statistical Modeling and Educational Technology in Public and Environmental Hygiene.
- The Department independently delivers two Master's Programs with great success: a) 'Environmental Communication and Health Promotion' and b) 'Health Promotion for the Elderly'. Additionally, it co-organizes with the Lab of Hygiene and Epidemiology of the Medical School of Athens and the Psychology Department of the National and Kapodistrian University of Athens a Master's in Health Promotion and Education.
- The Department successfully implements lifelong learning programs for its graduates, other health professionals, but also the wider public.

Public Health Policies Department

The Public Health Policies Department of the School of Public Health—successor to the National School of Public Health (ESDY, by its Greek acronym)—has an experienced staff and expertise in developing postgraduate courses, plus 95 years of academic tradition in public health.

Graduates of Master's Programs of the National School of Public Health have held and hold important positions of policy, strategy and interventions in the community, in the public and private health sector, and in non-governmental organizations across Greece and the world.

Three Master's Programs have been reestablished within the University of West Attica: a) 'Public Health', b) 'Leadership, Innovation and Political Values in Health' and c) 'Occupational and Environmental Health'. These programs operate in accordance with high educational standards of postgraduate studies provided by internationally recognized Universities in the field of health education and health services.

The Bachelor's Program of the Public Health Policies Department is scheduled to welcome its first students in October 2021.

Two institutional Research Laboratories have been established: a) the Lab of Infectious Disease Surveillance (EELNO, by its Greek acronym), including Reference Centers, and b) the Lab of Environment and Occupational Health (EPEY, by its Greek acronym).

The Doctoral Program provides the first sixteen (16) PhD candidates with specialization in the main disciplines of the Department.

Surveying and Geoinformatics Engineering Department

The mission of the Surveying and Geoinformatics Engineering Department is to provide a high level of university studies and, thus, advance and transmit knowledge on science and technology in the relevant fields, through research and teaching at both theoretical and applied level. Its curriculum and performed research focus on scientific practices such as measuring and collecting, processing, visualizing, managing, analyzing and disseminating online geometric as well as quantitative and qualitative information regarding the natural and man-made environment. Undergraduate and postgraduate studies represent a combination of the two main axes of mapping engineering: surveying and geoinformatics—on which the professional rights of the Department's graduates are essentially based. This ensures the alignment of graduates with the ever-changing demands of the labor market, so that they respond qualitatively to the scientific, technological, economic and social developments in the national and international environment.

The Department also provides 7th level (postgraduate) studies and 8th level (doctoral) studies for surveying engineers and geoinformatics engineers wishing to specialize in their field, but also in broader fields with which these two main axes collaborate and interact in the framework of interdisciplinary approaches needed to effectively produce informed and competent scientists. Research is carried out in two institutional Research Laboratories with a total of eight research units, which include 16 DEP members, one EDIP member and one ETEP member of the Department.

The Department offers an independent Master's Program titled 'Geospatial Technologies' (www.geospatial.uniwa.gr) and the Interdepartmental and Interuniversity MSc in Artificial Intelligence and Visual Computing (<https://msc-aivc.uniwa.gr>), in collaboration with the Informatics and Computer Engineering Department of the University of West Attica and the Informatics Department of the University of Limoges (France).

The Civil Engineering Department of the University of West Attica delivers the following three Master's Programs, which expand the Department's field of interest into research and applied topics that meet critical technological, productive and developmental needs: a) 'Structural Engineering', later amended as 'Seismic and Energy Retrofitting of Structures & Sustainable Development' (as of 2014); b) 'Applied Environmental Protection Policies and Techniques' (as of 2014); and c) 'Architectural and Structural Restoration of Historical Buildings and Ensembles' (as of 2017).

ERASMUS+

Erasmus+ is the European Commission's program for education, training, youth and sport,

aimed at enhancing skills and employability, and modernizing education, training and youth systems in all areas of Lifelong Learning (higher education, vocational education and training, adult education, school education, youth activities, etc.).

The action of Erasmus+ in the field of higher education (KA1) is inextricably linked to the Erasmus program and grants the mobility of students and staff to higher education institutions in participating countries.

The mobility of students and staff abroad is particularly important given the multitude of benefits involved. Through mobility, students have the opportunity to acquire new skills and qualifications that contribute to their personal development. Additionally, students moving to internships can gain valuable work experience in a business/ organization abroad. Also, the mobility component enables faculty and staff to upgrade their skills, exchange good practices and gain significant experience.



Erasmus+



In the case of Erasmus+ students,

the minimum duration of their study period is 3 months (or an academic trimester) while the total time abroad may not exceed 12 months per each study cycle (e.g. 12 months during undergraduate studies, 12 months during postgraduate studies, 12 months during doctoral studies).

During their Erasmus+ study period in a partner University, students receive a monthly grant, depending on the host country. Students who have been selected by their higher education institution to participate in Erasmus+ have to sign an Erasmus+ Grant Agreement for Studies.

The home institution must ensure the full academic recognition for satisfactorily completed activities during the Erasmus+ study period, as agreed in the Learning Agreement. The Erasmus+ mobility period should also be recorded in the Diploma Supplement.

An Erasmus+ Online Linguistic Support has also been designed to assist students in improving their linguistic skills before and during their mobility.

Students may receive an Erasmus+ grant as a contribution to their travel and subsistence costs. It may vary according to differences in living costs between their country and the destination country. There is an extra support for students from disadvantaged backgrounds. Additional funding is available for students with physical, mental or health-related conditions. These cases are treated with respect, confidence and medical privacy.

Students can apply through our University's International Office.

Currently the University of West Attica holds almost 450 Erasmus+ bilateral agreements with higher education institutions from European Union member countries and has also extended its cooperation strategy to countries worldwide with more than 150 bilateral agreements (International Credit Mobility).

The institutional Erasmus+ code is GEGALEO02.
